Hello From the Front Office!

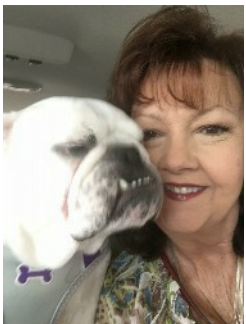

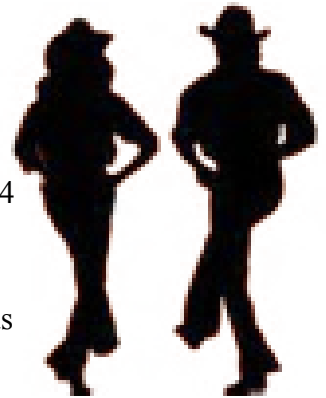

| 1/2 lb. fresh broccoli florets (about 1 3/4 cups) | 12 oz. hard salami, cubed |
| 12 oz. provolone cheese, cubed | 1 medium red onion, chopped |
| 4 garlic cloves, minced | |

Cook spiral pasta and tortellini according to package directions. Drain and rinse in cold water. 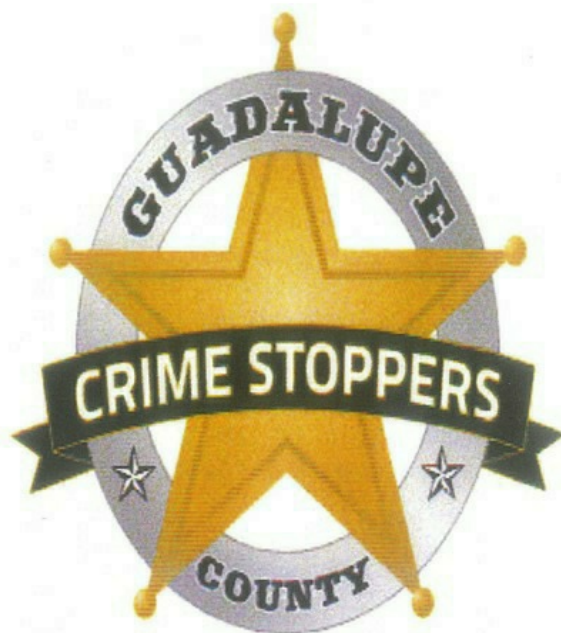
