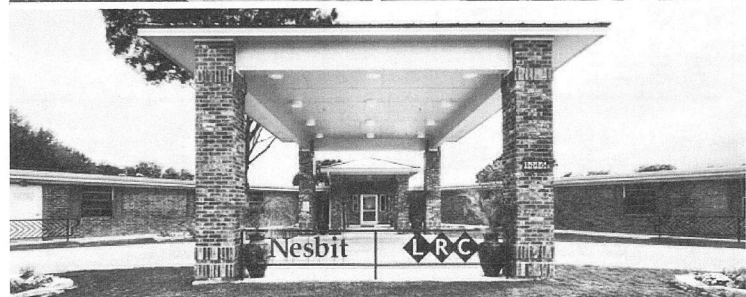

Strawberry Pretzel Salad

2 ½ C. Pretzels – finely crushed	3 Tbsp. Brown Sugar
1 C. Butter	1 pkg. (6 oz.) Strawberry Jell-O
1 Container (16 oz.) Fresh Strawberries, sliced	1 Container (8 oz.) Cream Cheese
1 C. Sugar	½ tsp. Vanilla
1 Container (8 oz.) Cool Whip	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, combine the crushed pretzels, brown sugar, and melted butter and press into a lightly greased 9 x 13 pan. Bake for 10 minutes.

Remove from oven and allow to cool completely. Once the pretzel crust is slightly cool, refrigerate it 30-60 minutes so that it gets really cool.

In the meantime, with an electric mixer, beat the cream cheese, sugar, and vanilla until smooth. Using a spatula, fold in the Cool Whip. Spread over cooled crust. (Make sure you spread this layer completely to the edges. You want to create a seal so your Jell-O doesn't leak through.) Return your pan to the fridge to chill.

Next, prepare the Jell-O according to the package directions **minus ¼ cup of water**. This is a personal preference, but I find using less water allows the Jell-O to firm up better. Put your bowl of Jell-O in the fridge to allow it to chill. **However, do not let it become completely firm.**

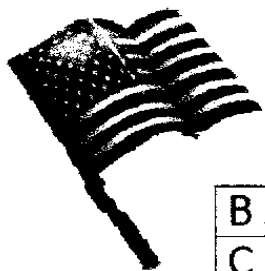
While the Jell-O cools, slice the strawberries. Then, place them on top of your chilled layer of cream cheese and cool whip. Once the Jell-O is chilled to about the consistency of jam or pudding (about an hour or two in the fridge), it is ready. Spoon or pour the Jell-O over the cream cheese layer. Return the pan to the fridge. Cool until the Jell-O is completely set (about an hour). Slice, serve, and enjoy!

NOTE: For best results, you must chill the layers between steps. This is an easy dessert/salad to make but it does take time due to chilling. Allow enough time to complete the entire recipe.

Easy Peach Cobbler

2 – 15 oz. Cans sliced peaches in syrup	½ C. (1 stick) Butter
1 C. self-rising Flour	1 C. Sugar
1 C. Milk	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Drain 1 can of peaches, reserve the syrup from one can. Place the butter in a 9x12 ovenproof baking dish. Heat the butter until melted. In a medium bowl, mix the flour and sugar. Stir in the milk and the reserved syrup. Pour the batter over the melted butter in the baking dish. Arrange peaches over the batter. Bake for 1 hour. The cobbler is done when the batter rises around the peaches and the crust is thick and golden brown. Serve warm with whipped cream.

The teacher asked Billie why he was late for school. He replied, "The sign back there says, 'Go Slow!'"

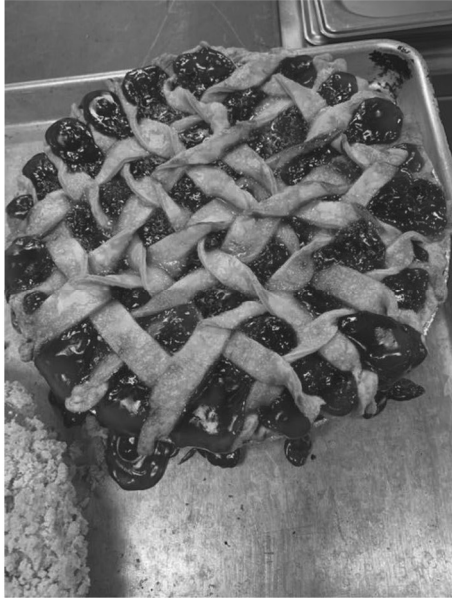

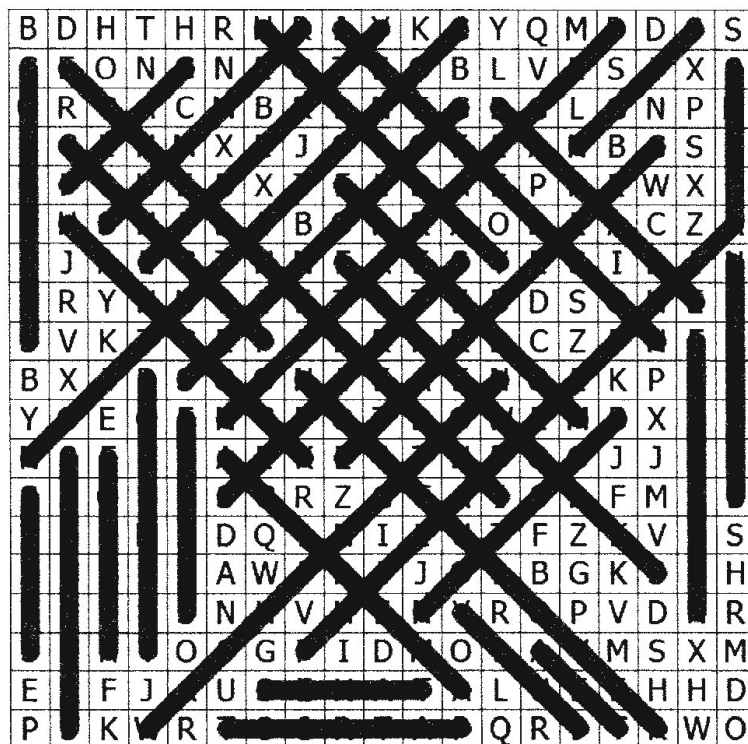

Fourth of July Word Search Answers



July Fun Facts

For many people in the Northern Hemisphere, July is one of the hottest and sunniest months of the year and is likely to be when many people book their holidays and vacations! July is also the midpoint of the year, starting the second half of the modern calendar. It is a hugely important month in the North American calendar for obvious reasons. July plays host to US Independence Day.

July's name comes from Julius Caesar, who was actually born towards the start of the month. It was originally known as *Quintillis* based on the ancient Roman calendar but was renamed in honor of the emperor.

Many people refer to July as the "hay month". This is because the heat at the height of summer is known to quash the grass, drying it out and turning it into hay. As all farmers know, hay is very handy indeed – and it is always less expensive for you to gather it yourself than to depend on suppliers. This is the month that gardeners will generally have much of their work cut out for them. This is because bugs and pests are likely to come out in droves, putting vegetation and plants at risk. It's also the best time to start getting those weeds down, as if you don't pull them up now, they'll start seeding.

There are two zodiac signs claiming July as their host month – if you were born in July, you are either a Cancer or a Leo. Those Cancer born July babies are independent and determined and they seldom seek help from anyone. They like to do things on their own. They tend to be highly organized and gifted with exceptional managerial skills, which can make them good team leaders or managers. The birth flowers for July are the lovely tall Larkspur and the striking Water Lily. The Larkspurs are a group of tall showy flowers that occur in beautiful colors of purple, blue, red, yellow or white. The petals fuse together forming a spur and hence the flower's name. The Water Lilies are a family of aquatic plants common to tropical and temperate regions, with large round floating leaves and stunning flowers in many colors and form.

It was in July when the first-ever telephone call was made. It took place between Canada and the US in 1881. It really did mark the start of those long summer phone calls. Some additional trivia that happened in July are: Zip Codes were first introduced for US mail in 1963, in 1884 Dow Jones and Co. published its first stock average, in 1950 *Radio Free Europe* was first broadcast, in 1997 NASA's Pathfinder space probe landed on the surface of Mars. In 1954, Elvis Presley made his radio debut when WHBQ Memphis played his recording for Sun Records, "*That's All Right*". In 1981 President Ronald Reagan appointed Sandra Day O'Connor to become the first female member of the Supreme Court.

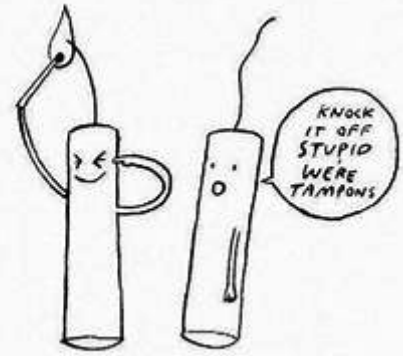

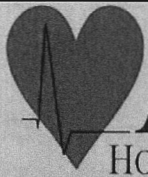

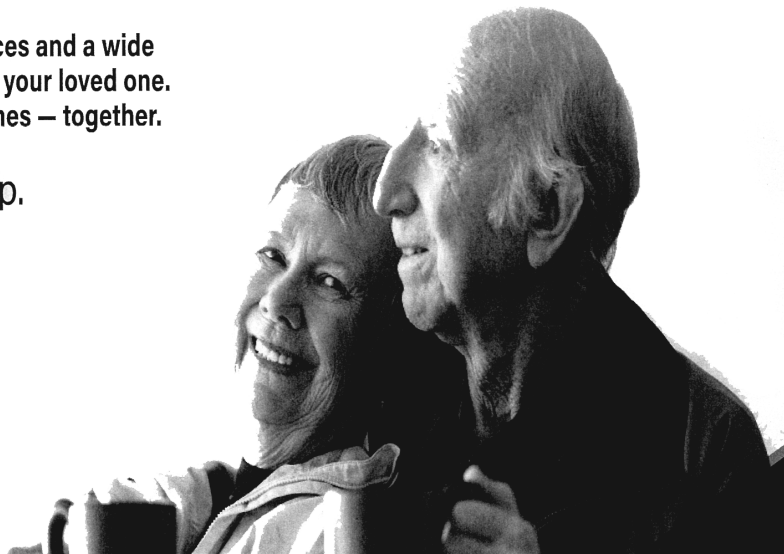
