Orange Buttermilk Salad

1 can (20 oz.) unsweetened crushed pineapple, undrained 3 TBSP sugar

- 1 package (6 oz.) orange flavored gelatin
- 2 cups buttermilk
- 1 carton (8 oz.) frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 cup chopped nuts

In a saucepan, combine pineapple and sugar; bring to a boil, stirring occasionally. When mixture boils, immediately add gelatin and stir until dissolved. Remove from heat; cool slightly. Stir in buttermilk. Chill until partially set. Fold in whipped topping and nuts. If necessary, chill until mixture mounds slightly. Pour into a lightly oiled 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ cup mold. Chill overnight.

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

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

- 6) Must clean your own area/space before you leave at 8:30 pm.


