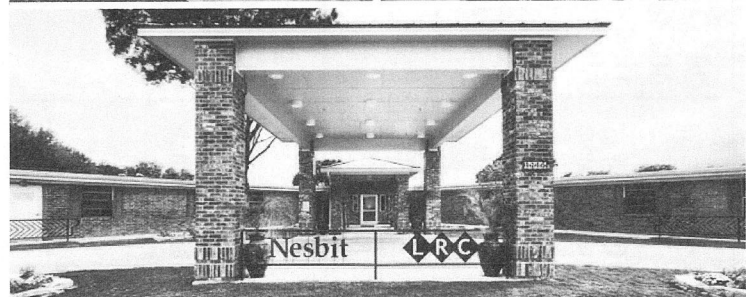

GRMC's new Women's Imaging Center offers a full range of comprehensive diagnostic services tailored specifically for women. The latest in medical technology is available for stereotactic breast biopsies, high-resolution 3-D breast imaging and ultrasound, pelvic studies, and bone density exams.

The wildflower theme throughout this well-appointed, private setting adjacent to the hospital's imaging department enhances the personal attention each patient is provided by their highly skilled technicians and board certified radiologists.

Investing in your comfort and safety

Even the most basic of health care needs - the bed upon which our inpatients rest during their hospital stay - has been updated with the latest in health care technology. GRMC recently invested almost \$1 million in the purchase of 75 new Stryker patient beds to enhance patient safety, patient experience, and caregiver safety. 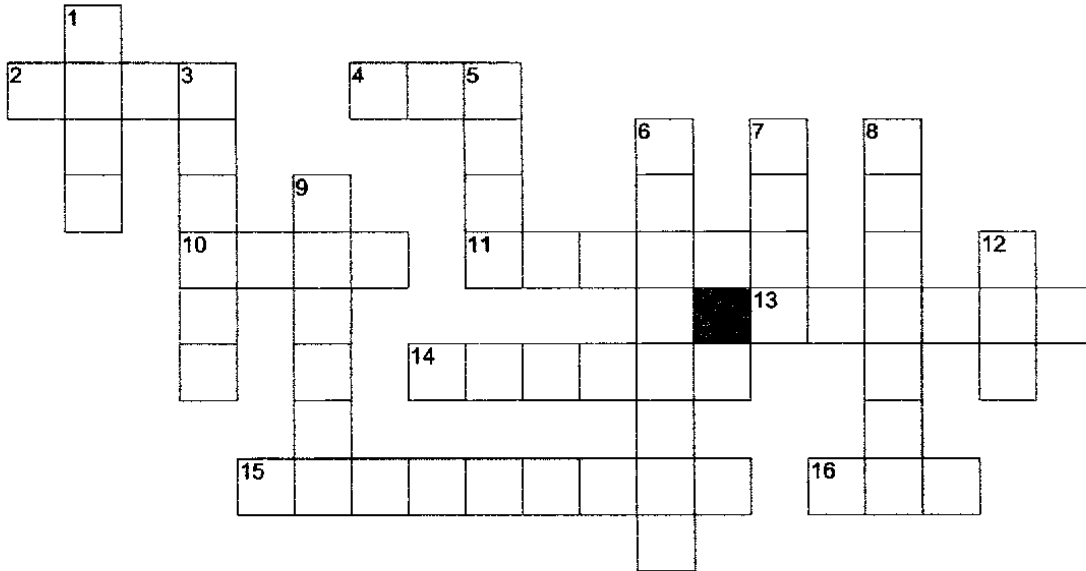

Why are there no Mother's Day sales? Well, because mothers are priceless.

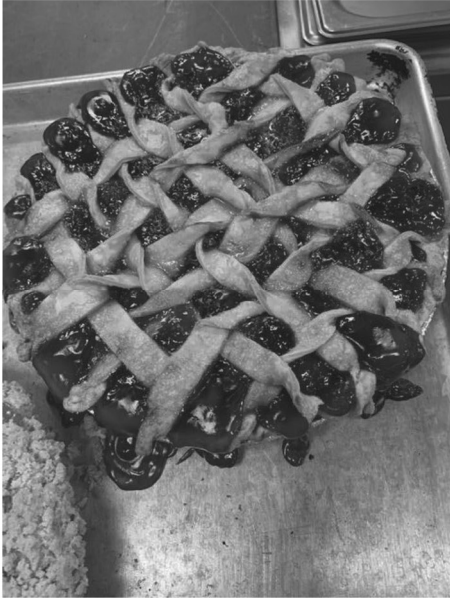

Fun Facts for May

Celebrate the gorgeous month of May! The Sun is warming, the birds are chirping, the flowers are blooming, and our gardens are growing. The month of May was named for the Greek Goddess Maia. She was the goddess of fertility and who oversaw the growth of plants. The Romans had a similar goddess named Bona Dea. The Romans called the month Maius. Over the years the name changed. It was first called May in the 1400's near the end of the Middle Ages. It is the third and last month of the season of spring.

The birthstone of May, the emerald, symbolizes success and love. This is a gemstone and a variety of the mineral beryl, colored green by trace amounts of chromium and/or sometimes vanadium. Beryl has a hardness of 7.5-8 on the Mohs scale. Most emeralds are highly included, so their toughness is classified as generally poor. Emeralds in antiquity were mined in Egypt, India, and Austria since at least the 14th century. Colombia is by far the world's largest producer of emeralds, constituting 50-95% of the world production.

May in the Northern Hemisphere is similar to November in the Southern Hemisphere. May was once considered a bad luck month to get married. There is a poem that says, "Marry in May and you'll rue the day". In Old English May is called the "month of three milkings" referring to a time when the cows could be milked three times a day.

Noteworthy dates are: May Day (May 1) and also is known as Lei Day in Hawaii, May 5 is Cinco de Mayo, Mother's Day, May 10, Armed Forces Day, May 16, and Memorial Day is May 25.

May's official flower is Lily of the Valley which has been told to bring romance, luck, happiness, purity and humility. These flowers are not true lilies. Instead, they are part of the Asparagus family and known for their sweet scent and fragrant, bell-shaped blooms that often come in white.

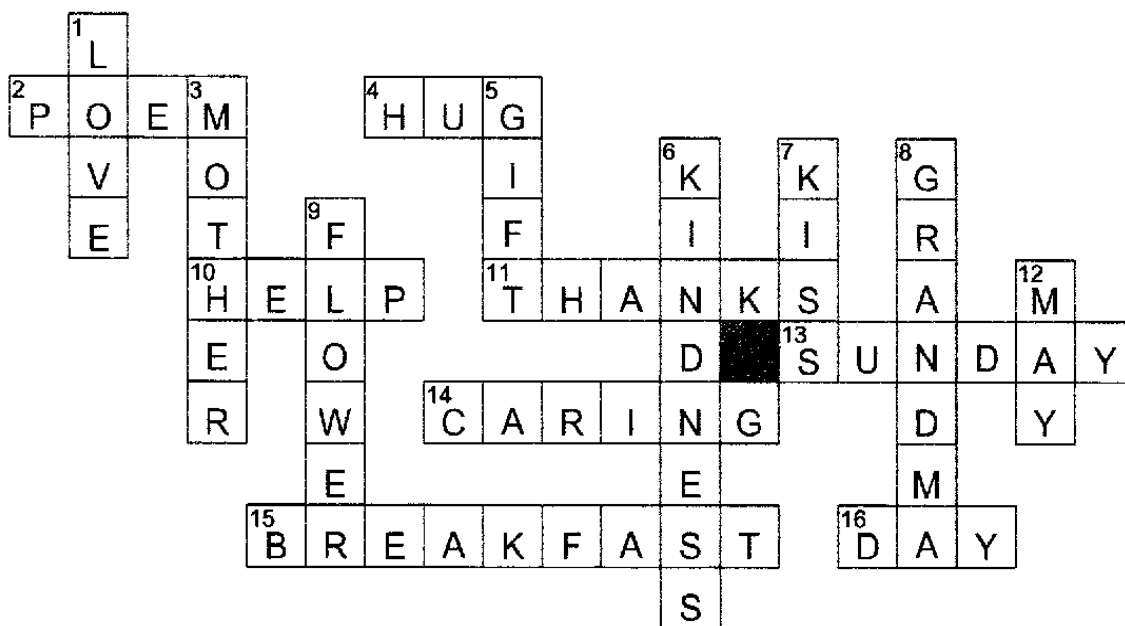
