

Cooking/Baking Notes:

From juicy immune boosting citrus to crunchy superfood carrots in this seasonal produce guide you will find listed below all the fruits and veggie that are in season for the month of March:

VEGGIES: artichokes, argula, alvocados, asparagus, broccoli, brussel sprouts, cabbage, carrots, cauliflower, celery, collard greens, cucumbers, kale, parsnips, onions, potatoes, spinach, spring onions, sweet potatoes and turnips

FRUITS: apples, bananas, clementines, grapefruit, kiwi, kumquats, lemon and limes, oranges, pears, persimmons, strawberries, and tangerines

<u>Paleo Flourless Chocolate Cake</u>: This decadent flourless chocolate cake is rich and creamy. This is an easy recipe, made with on 5 ingredients. Paleo is gluten free and tastes amazing!

Prep Time – 15 minutes Cook Time – 1 hour 10 minutes Serves – 8

1 C. Sugar 1/3 C. Water 1 Tblsp. Vanilla

Pinch of Salt 1 lb. (16oz.) Dark Chocolate Bar 2 sticks Butter

8 eggs

Raspberry/Apricot Glaze - 2 Tblsp. Apricot Preserves ½ C. Raspberries

Place oven rack in the middle position in the oven and reheat to 325 degrees. Line the bottom of a 9 inch springform pan with parchment paper and grease the sides of the pan really well. Melt butter and chocolate on the stove in a double boiler. (Make sure the water is not touching the glass bowl while the water is boiling. When melted, remove from the stove and let sit for a couple of minutes. Meanwhile, melt sugar and water in a small pan. When the sugar has dissolved, add the mixture to the chocolate and butter mixture. Add a pinch of salt and the vanilla. Beat the eggs with a mixer on high speed for about 8 minutes until the volume has quadrupled in size. The eggs will be light yellow in color and fluffy. Fold about 1/6 of the beaten eggs into the chocolate mixture using a large rubber spatula. Fold in carefully, trying not to overmix. Repeat with the remainder of the eggs. This will appear to be a homogeneous mixture. Pour the batter into the prepared 9 inch springform pan. Place the pan in another deep baking dish (I used an aluminum deep roasting pan) and place the pan on the oven rack and very carefully pour in enough boiling water to come about halfway up the sides of the springform pan. (This is vital for even baking!) Bake for about 1 hour and 10 minutes or until center is set. It's very hard to overbake this dessert. When done, place the cake on a cooking wire rack to cool without removing the springform pan. The cake rises a little bit when it bakes, but it does shrink as it cools. Once cool, remove the springform pan and place on a cake stand or plate. GLAZE: Heat the apricot preserves in a small pan over medium heat. Break it down with a spoon, and remove from the heat once it is broken down. Fold in ½ cup or more to your liking raspberries and mix carefully, making sure you don't break them. I put this mixture in the center of my cake. Enjoy!

<u>3 Ingredient Chocolate Chip Cookies</u>: These 3 ingredient cookies are your instant cookie fix! No flour, no eggs, no milk and no grains needed. They are soft and will melt in you mouth!

1 C. Peanut Butter, smooth or creamy

1/3 C. Maple Syrup

1 C. Chocolate chips

In a large bowl, add peanut butter and maple syrup and mix until combined. Fold through the chocolate chips. Cover the bowl and freeze for 1 hour or refrigerate for 2 hours. Preheat your oven to 350 degrees. Line a large baking sheet with parchment paper. Remove mixture from the freezer or refrigerator. Using your hands, form balls of dough about teaspoon size or walnut size and place them onto the lined baking sheet. Bake the cookies for 10-12 minutes or until they are firm around the edges. Remove from the oven and let cool.

WHAT IS MARCH MADNESS?

The NCAA Division I men's basketball tournament, branded as NCAA March Madness and commonly called March Madness, is a single-elimination tournament played each spring in the United States, currently featuring 68 college basketball teams from the Division I level of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), to determine the national championship. The tournament was created in 1939 by the National Association of Basketball Coaches, and was the idea of Ohio State coach Harold Olsen.[1] Played mostly during March, it has become one of the most popular annual sporting events in the United States.[2]

It has become extremely common in popular culture to predict the outcomes of each game, even among non-sports fans; it is estimated that tens of millions of Americans participate in a bracket pool contest every year. Mainstream media outlets such as ESPN, CBS Sports and Fox Sports host tournaments online where contestants can enter for free. Employers have also noticed a change in the behavior of employees during this time: they have seen an increase in the number of sick days used, extended lunch breaks and even the rescheduling of conference calls to allow for more tournament watching.[3] Many handicappers and pundits also offer advice for winning their own bracket.[4][5]

The tournament teams include champions from 32 Division I conferences (which receive automatic bids), and 36 teams which are awarded at-large berths. These "at-large" teams are chosen by an NCAA selection committee, then announced in a nationally televised event dubbed Selection Sunday. The 68 teams are divided into four regions and organized into a single-elimination "bracket", which pre-determines - when a team wins a game - which team it will face next. Each team is "seeded", or ranked, within its region from 1 to 16. After the First Four round, the remainder of the tournament begins the third Thursday of March, and is played over the course of three weekends, at pre-selected neutral sites across the United States. Teams, seeded by rank, proceed through a single-game elimination bracket beginning with the First Four round, a first round consisting of 64 teams playing in 32 games over the course of a week, the "Sweet Sixteen" and "Elite Eight" rounds the next week and weekend, respectively, and - for the last weekend of the tournament - the "Final Four" round. The two Final Four games are played the Saturday preceding the first Sunday in April, with the championship game on Monday. These four teams, one from each region (East, South, Midwest, and West), compete in a preselected location for the national championship.






