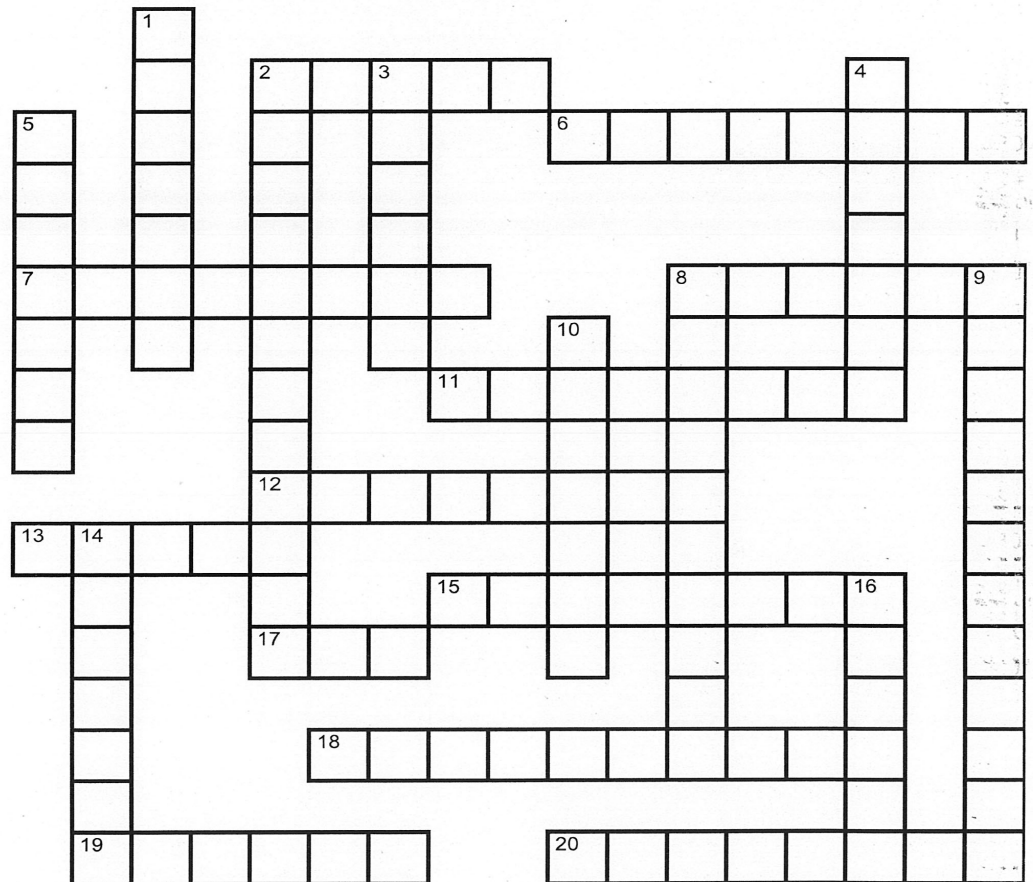

August has been a month of pivotal historical events, from wars and political milestones to cultural achievements and notable births.

Key Historical Events

Wars and Conflicts:

The Warsaw Uprising began on August 1, 1944, when 40,000 Polish patriots fought German troops, though the rebellion was eventually quashed two months later. On August 9, 1945, the second atomic bomb was dropped on Nagasaki, Japan, killing approximately 70,000 people and marking a turning point in World War II. Richard Nixon resigned the U.S. presidency on August 9, 1974, due to the Watergate scandal.

Political Milestones:

On August 2, 1776, most members of the Continental Congress signed the Declaration of Independence in Philadelphia. August 28, 1919, marked the signing of the Treaty of Versailles, officially ending World War I.

Exploration and Discovery:

Christopher Columbus departed Spain in August 1492, beginning his voyage that connected the Old and New Worlds. Soviet Russia declared war on Japan on August 8, 1945, advancing into Manchuria

Scientific and Technological Advances:

Albert Einstein wrote to President Franklin D. Roosevelt on August 2, 1939, warning about the potential of atomic weapons. The Limited Nuclear Test Ban Treaty, signed in August, prohibited atmospheric nuclear testing, marking a major Cold War arms control milestone.

The Silver Center was founded in 1994 by a group of wonderful senior citizens looking for a place for members and friends to have a place to get together, visit over lunch, volunteer and stay active while playing Bridge, Scott, Dominoes, Mahjongg and Dancing! We are a membership driven charity group who are governed by a Board of Directors. WE GET NO FEDERAL OR GOVERNMENTAL FUNDING and we need donations and rental business to stay afloat. People of all ages and ethnic backgrounds are welcome to join our membership (which is only \$40 a year) and the public can also rent our center, even if they are not members.

Our charity started out in downtown Seguin, but they purchased Benzinger's Model Market (a grocery store) a few years later and renovated it to have the site we now use as our Center.

This is an old building with a lot of needs and machinery needing upkeep and repair to allow us to run smoothly. We also have a pot-hole ridden parking lot that needs repairs to remain safe from trip hazards. Any donations that we receive can be earmarked for a single or multiple use project.

In addition to all of the activities that the Silver Center has to offer, we have a **Lending Closet** where people can *borrow medical equipment* (like walkers, wheel chairs or shower benches) and we hope instead of throwing these useful items in the trash that some of you might also tell folks to donate them to us... so others can benefit from them! The lending closet has no AC and no electrical lighting because it is in an exterior part of our building. Volunteers try to keep things straight in the storeroom but it has to be during the day... and on a cool day!

The entire community can benefit from the use of our facility

- For example we host weekly service club meetings (Like the Lions Club luncheon) and we can also serve as a place to hold fundraisers and dinners for various community service groups.
- The Center is a beautiful place for people to rent for their weddings, anniversary parties, engagement parties, graduations and birthday celebrations! We also host events like health fairs and craft fairs and even Celebration of Life events, when families need a place to gather to remember a loved one's life.
- We have rooms for hosting events from groups as small as 12 people in The Magnolia room that seats 30 for learning sessions, to small parties in the Yellow Rose room that seats 70 for meetings, small weddings or luncheons & the main ballroom (called the Crystal Chandelier) seats 200 all while leaving a large wooden dance floor for guests to dance the night away under our three chandeliers! Events like weddings and fundraisers are booked in the ballroom all the way into next year!

- We are the only Seguin based 501(c)(3) non-profit organization that will *deliver meals* to senior citizens' homes in Seguin. Hot, delicious meals are \$13, and the delivery is free (brought to you by our wonderful volunteers).
- Our building is run by a dedicated staff and a handful of volunteers. We hope that you might consider being a volunteer to help us!

2nd & 4th Friday Night Dances

Doors open at 6:30pm, Dancing from 7:30 - 11pm

The Silver Center hosts the best local country music bands! Dances are open to people of all ages. Dances are SMOKE-FREE and our regular dancers maintain that our wooden dance floor is the best in the area! Our doors are open to everyone! Come on out and join us

Spicy Shrimp with Creamy Corn Rice

SERVINGS: 4 PREP TIME: 10 MINS COOK TIME: 20 MINS TOTAL TIME: 30 MINS

INGREDIENTS

FOR THE SHRIMP:

- ☐ 1.25 lbs wild shrimp,, peeled + deveined
- ☐ 3 tbs olive oil
- ☐ 3/4 tsp salt
- ☐ 3/4 tsp chili powder
- ☐ 3/4 tsp dried oregano
- ☐ 3/4 tsp paprika
- ☐ 3/4 tsp onion powder
- ☐ 3/4 tsp garlic powder

CREAMY RICE:

- ☐ 4 tbs butter
- ☐ 1 onion,, diced
- ☐ 1 jalapeno,, fine chop
- ☐ 5 cloves garlic,, minced
- ☐ 3 cups corn
- ☐ 1.5 cups basmati rice
- ☐ 3 cups vegetable broth
- ☐ 1.5 cups heavy whipping cream

INSTRUCTIONS

SHRIMP:

- 1 Place shrimp in a bowl and add the oil and season with all the seasonings. Toss to coat all.
- 2 Heat a large deep skillet on medium high and add the shrimp. Cook for 2 minutes per side, turning once. Transfer to a plate and keep warm

RICE:

- 3 To the same pan, melt the butter and then add the onion and jalapeño. Cook for 4 minutes. Add the garlic and cook for 30 seconds.
- 4 Add the corn and cook for another 30 seconds. Season with salt and pepper to taste. Add the rice and cook for 1 minute.
- 5 Finally add the broth and cream and mix to combine. Heat on LOW to simmer, COVER THE PAN and cook for about 10-12 minutes or until rice is cooked and absorbed most of the liquid. Stir occasionally. Add more liquid if your rice is still uncooked and continue to cook if needed.
- 6 Plate with your shrimp and top with chives or parsley.

NOTES

This recipe uses Basmati white rice. If your rice is different, it may take longer to cook. Check your package instructions and you make have to increase the time, broth and heavy cream.

Lemon Bars

Servings	Prep time	Cooking time	Chilling time	Total time
24 servings	20 minutes	45 minutes	120 minutes	3 hours 5 minutes

Instructions

- 1 Preheat the oven to 350°Fahrenheit (175°C) and line a 9x13-inch baking pan with parchment paper.
- 2 For the crust: In a medium bowl, whisk the flour, granulated sugar, and salt, then add the butter. Use a pastry cutter or a knife to cut the butter into the flour mixture. Alternatively, rub it by hand until the mixture resembles coarse crumbs. Stir in the vanilla extract.
- 3 Press the crust evenly into the prepared baking pan and bake for 15-20 minutes until lightly golden brown.
- 4 For the Filling: In a separate large bowl, whisk the eggs, sugar, flour, lemon juice, and lemon zest until smooth.
- 5 When the crust is done, carefully pour the filling over the top and bake for 20-25 minutes, or until the edges are set but still slightly wobbly in the middle.
- 6 Let the bars cool completely on the counter. Then, chill in the fridge for 1-2 hours.
- 7 Slice the lemon bars, dust with powdered sugar, and enjoy!

Notes

- Serve them cold for the best taste and texture.

For the crust:

- 2 cups all-purpose flour
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup (2 sticks) unsalted butter, cold and cut into cubes
- 1 teaspoon vanilla extract

For the filling:

- 4 large eggs, at room temperature
- 2 cups granulated sugar
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour
- 1 cup freshly squeezed lemon juice (about 6 lemons)
- 1 tablespoon grated lemon zest
- Powdered Sugar for serving



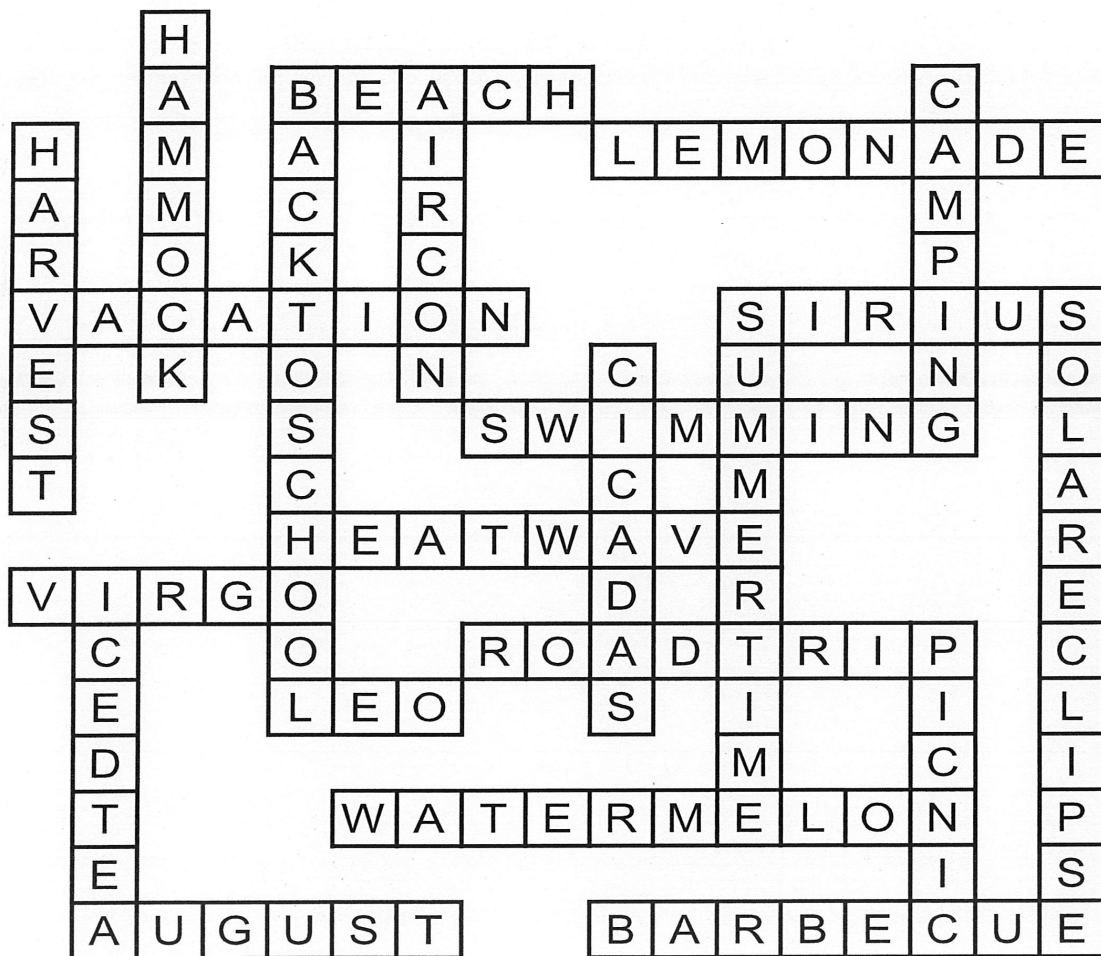
