

Cranberry Cheesecake Shortbread Bars

These bars start with my favorite, super tender shortbread base and are topped with a creamy, slightly tangy thanks to the sour cream cheesecake filing. Fresh cranberries are simmered with orange juice and zest to make a sweet sauce and then are dropped over the creamy cheesecake filling to make one of the prettiest color contrasts. More shortbread is crumbled over the cheesecake and then the bars are baked, cooled, and dusted with a snowy covering of powdered sugar.

2 ½ sticks Butter, softened	¼ C Sour Cream
2 ½ C. Flour	½ C. Water
2/3 C. Powdered Sugar	½ C. Orange Juice
1 pkg. (8 oz) Cream Cheese, softened	1 T. Orange Zest
1/3 C. Sugar	1 C. Sugar
½ tsp. Vanilla	12 oz. Fresh Cranberries
1 Egg	Powdered Sugar, for dusting

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9 x 13 baking dish with parchment paper (for easy removal of bars for slicing). Place butter, flour, and powdered sugar in the bowl of a stand mixer and mix together with a paddle attachment until just combined. Reserve 1/3 of the Dough and press the other 2/3's into the bottom of a 9 x 13 baking dis. Smooth out dough as best you can. Bake the dough in the preheated oven for 10 minutes. Remove and set aside while you make the cheesecake filing.

In a mixing bowl, beat together the cream cheese and sugar until smooth. Add the egg, sour cream, and vanilla and beat together until smooth, scraping down the sides as necessary. Pour over the par-baked crust.

In a saucepan, combine the water, orange juice, zest, and 1 C. sugar. Bring to a boil over medium/high heat, stirring to dissolve the sugar. Rinse the cranberries and discard any that are not up to par. Add cranberries to the boiling syrup and reduce heat to a simmer. Let simmer for 10 minutes, or until the cranberries have mostly burst and sauce has thickened.

Using a spoon, drop cranberries and sauce evenly over the cheesecake. Crumble the remaining shortbread crust over the top of the cheesecake and berries.

Bake for 25-30 minutes, or until the cheesecake is puffed up slightly and the crumble is golden on top. Remove and let cool. Chill for 2-3 hours. Dust with powdered sugar and cut into bars.



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The Daughters of the Republic of Texas Seguin Chapter


The DRT recognizes traditions and historical leaders throughout the year to perpetuate the memory and spirit of Texas History.

January 26th honors President, Mirabeau B. Lamar, the second President of the Republic of Texas. His accomplishments earned him the title of "Father of Education in Texas" On this date in 1839 the Republic of Texas Congress passed The Education Act. His proposal to the legislature of the Republic of Texas set aside public lands to finance public education. Although it was decades later that the public schools were established, Lamar's advocacy of the program earned him this recognition.

The Seguin chapter was formalized in 1969 and has held the annual Toast to Texas celebration on March 2, Texas Independence Day, since 1986. Anyone interested in learning more about the Daughters of the Republic of Texas and how to become a member please send an email to SeguinDRT@gmail.com.



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



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January Fun Facts..You Never Knew About

For the majority of people, January symbolizes new beginnings and a fresh start. For others, it's just another ordinary month!

The name for January comes from the Roman god, Janus, who is always depicted with two heads. He uses one head to look back on the year before, and the other head to look forward into the New Year.

Oddly enough, couples tend to separate or divorce more so in January than any other other of the year. In Pasadena, California, there has been a Rose Parade held every year since 1890. It has since been broadcasted worldwide and is typically viewed in over 100 countries around the world.

If you were born in January, your birthstone is a garnet. The word garnet comes from the 14th century Middle English word garnet, meaning "dark red". The word is from Latin granatum, which means "seed," and is called so because of the gemstone's resemblance to the red seeds of the pomegranate. This stone, said to represent balance, which is definitely something we all need after the crazy busy month of December.

January was a monumental year for Alaska! As of January 3, 1959, Alaska officially became the 49th state of the United States. In the United Kingdom, some people practice "Dry January." This is a movement to encourage people to quit drinking alcohol for the month in order to encourage public health. One of the most influential events in the U.S. happened in January – on January 1, 1892, Ellis Island opened, allowing for the immigration of over 20 million people. If you are a fan of the star? Celebrities, that is! Then you'll be interested to know that the first-ever Emmy Awards were held on January 25, 1949. January brought the end of the monarchy in Hawaii when Queen Liliuokalani was forced to abdicate on the 24th of the month.

January has two zodiac signs – Capricorn which is until January 19, and Aquarius, which is for the rest of the month.

The dianthus caryophyllus is the birth flower of January – more commonly known as the carnation. . It comes in many beautiful colors. But, the fancier Latin name is much prettier, though!

So, January may well be the month for a new start, dreaming big, and achieving new goals, but it also a month with a rich past. As you step into a new year, remember to appreciate the incredible events that have occurred during January.






