



Father's Day Grilled Cuban Mojo Pork

¼ C. Olive Oil (Save 1 teaspoon for sauce)	1 Tbsp. Orange Zest
¼ C. Orange Juice	¼ C. Lime Juice
1 C. Cilantro (stems removed), chopped fine	8 Cloves Garlic, minced
2 tsp. dried Oregano	2 tsp. Ground Cumin
1 Tbsp. Brown Sugar, packed tight	1 tsp. Salt
1 tsp. Pepper	2 ½ lb. boneless Pork Roast, fat trimmed

1. Remove pork from packaging, rinse and pat dry with a paper towel. You want to trim away big pieces of fat from the roast if there is any. When cooking on the grill the fat will cause flame ups and burn quite quickly.
2. Into a zip lock bag, olive oil, orange zest, juice, lime juice, cilantro, garlic, oregano, cumin, and brown sugar. Mix well. Then place pork roast into the bag and seal removing out as much air as possible. Make sure to move the marinade around to cover the entire pork roast. Place bag in a bowl in the refrigerator and let marinate for at least an hour, up to overnight. The longer the more flavor is imparted. When ready to grill, remove pork from the bag and save marinade. Pat the roast dry and season with salt and pepper.
3. Preheat grill to a high heat, or using a gas grill to high (450 degrees – 500 degrees). Once grill is hot, sear all sides for 7 minutes browning well. Then turn off one section of the grill to leave the pork on. Ideally it will be the middle of the grill, but if you only have 2 gas knobs to use, just turn one off and place the pork on the side that is turned off. Using this indirect heat cooking method you will not overcook and cause the pork to dry out. Reduce heat to medium high (350 degrees) and close the lid. Cook for about 1 hour or until pork reached 145-150 degrees internal temperature. Remove from grill; let rest for 10-20 minutes to allow juices to remain in the pork. If you cut into it right away, all the juices will pour out onto your plate. By waiting, the pork juices remain in the meat for the juiciest, most tender bites of pork. While pork is grilling, place the marinade in a small saucepan, add on teaspoon of olive oil and bring to a boil for 10 minutes. Remove from heat and bring to room temperature. Cut the pork against the grain and serve with a spoonful of the cooked marinade over the top.


If you prefer to cook in oven, following directions above for #1-#2. Place in ovenproof dish; add about 1 ½ cups chicken broth into pan with pork roast, cover and cook for 2 hours or until pork reached 140 – 150 degrees. Remove from oven and let sit while you prepare marinade, slice and enjoy.

Father's Day Best Chewy Chocolate Chip Oatmeal Cookies

½ C. Butter, softened	¼ C. Granulated Sugar
½ C. packed, Brown Sugar	1 Egg
1 tsp. Vanilla	¼ C. All-purpose flour
1 ½ C. Old Fashioned Rolled Oats	½ tsp. Baking Soda
Pinch of Salt	¼ C. semi-sweet Chocolate Chips

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees. In a large bowl, cream together the butter, granulated sugar, and brown sugar using a stand mixer or an electric hand mixer. Add in the egg and vanilla and continue to beat until light and fluffy. Add in the flour, oats, baking soda and salt and beat on low until combined. Stir in the chocolate chips. Scoop out 1-2 tablespoons of dough and place onto a parchment lined cookie sheet about 2 inches apart. Bake for 8-10 minutes until golden brown on the edges. Cool on a wire rack or eat right out of the oven!

For all 60 years, he had never thought about the box. One day the little old woman got very sick and the doctor said she would never recover.



June Fun Facts

June has both the longest and the shortest days of the year depending on where you are standing. If you live in the northern hemisphere, the June 21st is the longest day, if you live in the southern hemisphere, then the 21st is the shortest day of the year. June 21st is the first day of summer in the northern hemisphere.

If you were born in June, then you are one of two star signs. If you were born on or before June 20, then you are a Gemini. Gemini's are said to be passionate, adaptable, and smart. If born on or after the 21st of June, then you are a Cancer. Those born under the Cancer sign are said to be loyal friends with great emotional depth.




